President/CEO's Report

It's my pleasure to report that Tarrant County's Credit Union remains financially strong and is growing.

Through diligent efforts to improve operating efficiencies, we were able to overcome the negative impact from fraud losses that plagued the entire financial industry prior to the conversion of credit cards to EMV CHIP technology in 2016 and saw an improvement in income of over \$500,000. Our



and saw an improvement in income of over \$500,000. Our loan quality remains significantly better than peer average, and the products and services offered at TCCU parallel those of financial institutions five times our size.

Throughout 2017, we continued to improve methods to protect your privacy and account information and implement ways in which to streamline the lending process to make access to financing easier for our members. We restructured our member service call center and established a new lending call center to expedite member requests and improve member service, and expanded our communication platform to make reaching member service personnel easier.

I'm particularly proud of our community efforts this past year and the generous contributions of time and money our Credit Union staff has made to help those less fortunate. For our work with Fort Worth Renaissance Heights United, Tarrant Area Food Bank, Presbyterian Night Shelter, several Title 1 schools in Tarrant County, and independent efforts to provide financial education, provisions for the homeless, coats for children in need in Tarrant County, and support for law enforcement officers, the Credit Union was awarded the prestigious Dora Maxwell Social Responsibility Community Service Award for Texas. This is the second time we've received this award and recognition; a true testament to the social responsibility we, at the Credit Union, feel for our community. We are grateful for the opportunity to serve you, our members, and our community.

As we focus on the coming year, we will continue our emphasis on operational efficiencies, product awareness and innovation and overall member service. We are fiscally strong and well-positioned for continued growth, and look forward to serving you for many years to come.
